On **January 29<sup>th</sup>**, grades 5-8 students will have the opportunity to participate in a **ski trip to Mount Pakenham**. This is not a class trip, but rather a school trip for students wanting to explore the sport of skiing. The fees for this activity are on the following page, and <u>payment can be made via School Cash Online</u>. Please ensure that you fill all forms out correctly and, in their entirety, and return these to M.Kyte. **First come**, **first served** as space on the buses is limited to 50 students plus 4 supervisors/teachers.

Parents who wish to attend are welcome and encouraged so that we may maintain the proper supervision ratio of 1 supervisor to 10 students. Parents must be able to ski/snowboard. Lessons are not provided for parent volunteers. Remember that parent volunteers require police checks. You will also need to register through the above link.

Participants of all skiing abilities are welcome. All students, regardless of ability, are required to take a lesson prior to skiing. Mount Pakenham's Station Teaching Format helps beginner skiers learn at their own pace through a series of seven skill stations supervised by certified instructors. After completing the first six stations, students learn to use the chairlift under the guidance of an adult supervisor and then practice on beginner-friendly slopes. Safety is prioritized, and students who don't meet chairlift criteria can continue to develop their skills at the Beginner Centre. <a href="Note">Note</a>: Snowboarding is not permitted as per the ALCDSB policy.

We will be leaving school at 7:00am. Our ski time will be approximately 10am – 3pm. Students will need to be picked up from school at approximately 6:00pm. Should we be returning late, an email will be sent home.

#### Alpine Skier's/Snow Boarder's Responsibility Code

Officially endorsed by: Ontario Snow Resorts Association

There are elements of risk in skiing and snow boarding that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the trails, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

Skiing/Snowboarding participation comes with inherent risk of falls or injury.

Excursion Organizers must consult the Ontario School Board Insurance Exchange Ski
Trip Guidelines to reduce elements of risk associated with skiing and snowboarding.
Snow Boarding – Secondary Schools Only

- 1. Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- 2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3. Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above
- 4. Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- 5. If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- 6. Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- 7. Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- 8. Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through the use of alcohol or drugs.
- 10. You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safety load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
- 11. Wear a helmet during all Alpine activities.

#### Skier/Snowboarder Classifications

These stages are consistent with the operations of member Ski Resorts of the Ontario Ski Resorts' Association and adapted from the Ontario School Board Insurance Exchange Ski Trip Guidelines (2015). The classifications must appear on the Parent Consent Form and checked off by the parent/guardian. The Ontario School Board Insurance (OSBIE) Ski Trip Guidelines are recommended reading for excursion organizers.

SNOWBOARDING IS FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS ONLY.

All students must be classified under one of the following:

#### Non-Skier/Non-Snowboarder:

The student has never skied nor snowboarded before.

#### Beginner:

The student has skied or snowboarded once or twice or a few times per year and has experienced and maintained control on a number of novice hills of varying degree. He/she is able to stop and turn both directions with some success. They are comfortable on green/beginner/some intermediate slopes. May need assistance with getting on/off lifts.

#### Intermediate:

The student has skied /snowboarded on many occasions and has experienced a variety of hills and different ski areas. He/she can turn and stop under control using recognized formal techniques. They ski/snowboard with confidence on intermediate slopes.

#### Advanced:

The student is an experienced and competent skier/snowboarder. He/she has received formal instruction, knows and understands the Alpine Responsibility Code and can demonstrate ability at an advanced level. Such students can be called upon to assist in the program.

Note: All elementary students are required to take a lesson at the ski hill prior to skiing on their own. Skiing/snowboarding is a sport with physical demands and inherent risks which are beyond the control of the snow resort. Falls, collisions and other incidents may occur and cause injury. Skiers/snowboarders must assume the risks and dangers.
